Section-II: Instructions to Bidders (ITB)

Note: - All the procurement procedures shall be conducted in accordance with Punjab Procurement Authority Act-2009 and Punjab Procurement Rules-2014. In case of any conflict between the provision of this document and PPRA Act-2009/ PPRA Rules- 2014, the later shall prevail.

E-Procurement: Punjab PPRA Board vide Letter No. SO(I&C1) 5-4-2024 dated 09.05.2024 has directed that in order to improve governance, management, transparency, accountability and quality of public procurement of goods, works and services, Competent Authority has been pleased to direct that E-Procurement shall be mandatory for all Public Offices including Attached Departments, Autonomous Bodies, Companies and Authorities in Punjab with effect from 01.07.2024.

Therefore, all conditions pertaining to implementation of E-Procurement System in Public Offices Punjab shall be observed in this bidding document and subsequent procedures.

- All E-bids must be accompanied by a Bid Security of the estimated price, as mentioned in the advertisement, in the name of "SSP/Admn, Counter Terrorism Department Punjab," and in the form of CDR/Bank Guarantee / Demand Draft / Pay Order. The original Bid security will be submitted to the office of SSP/Admin, Counter Terrorism Department, Punjab, Lahore before or on closing date and time for submission of E Bids.

2.1 – Introduction		
2.1.1	Scope of Bid	The Procuring Agency (PA), as indicated in the Bid Data Sheet (BDS) invites Bids for the provision of Goods as specified in the Section-IV Bid Data Sheet (BDS) and Section III – Technical Specifications & Section VII- Schedule of Requirements. The successful Bidders will be expected to deliver, install / commission the goods within the specified period and timeline(s) as stated in the BDS.
2.1.2	Source of Funds	The Procuring Agency named in the Bid Data Sheet has received budget from the Government of Punjab. The Procuring Agency intends to apply the provided funds/ a portion of this budget to make eligible payments under the contract for which the Invitation to bids has been issued.
2.1.3	Eligible Bidders	(i) The Invitation to Bids is open to all suppliers i.e., association of firms/companies/sole proprietor/ general order suppliers / (JV, if applicable), registered with relevant Registration Authorities and Tax Departments/ Authorities (Income Tax, Sales Tax & Punjab Sales Tax etc.), and registered on e-Procurement System (EPADS), except as provided hereinafter. (ii) Bidders should not be associated, or have been associated in the past, directly or indirectly, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the Procuring Agency to provide consultancy services for the preparation

		of the design, specifications, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods to be purchased under this Invitation to Bids [if applicable]. (iii) Government-owned enterprises may participate only if they are duly/legally authorized in this regard by the respective/relevant competent forum/authority. (iv) Bidders shall not be under a declaration of blacklisting by the Procuring Agency. (v) The invitation for Bids is open to all prospective firms / companies, Suppliers, Manufacturers or Authorized Agents / Dealers / Distributors subject to any provisions or licensing / regulatory requirements issued by the respective National / Provincial Professional Statutory Body established for that particular trade or business as mentioned in bid data sheet. (vi) A Bidder shall not have a conflict of interest. All Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be non-Responsive. A Bidder may be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this bidding process, if they: - Are associated or have been associated for the procurement of the goods to be purchased under this Invitation for Bids, directly or indirectly with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the Procuring Agency to provide consulting services for the preparation of the design, specifications and other documents to be used. - Have controlling shareholders in common; or - Receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from any of them; or - Have the same legal representative for purposes of this Bid; or - Have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about or influence on the Bid of another Bidder, or influence the decisions of the Procuring Agency regarding this Bidding process; or (vii) A Bidder may be ineligible if:- - The Bidder / entities are declared bankrupt or, in the case of company or firm, insolvent; - Payments in favor of the Bidder / entities are suspended in accordance with the judgment of a court of law other than a judgment declaring bankruptcy and resulting, in accordance with the national laws, in the total or partial loss of the right to administer and dispose of its property; - Legal proceedings are established against such Bidder / entities involving an order suspending payments and which may result, in accordance with the national laws, in a declaration of bankruptcy or in any other situation entailing the total or partial loss of the right to administer and dispose of the property; - The Bidder is convicted, by a final judgment, of any
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		offence involving professional conduct; e. The Bidder is debarred and blacklisted due to involvement in corrupt and fraudulent practices in accordance with the provision of section 17A of PPRA Act, 2009 and Rule-21, read with Schedule appended with, Punjab Procurement Rules, 2014. f. The Bidder is debarred and blacklisted in general (i.e., to the extent of all public procurement) due to consistent performance failure in accordance with the section 17A of PPRA Act, 2009 and Rule-21, read with Schedule appended with, Punjab Procurement Rules, 2014. (viii) Bidders shall provide to the Procuring Agency evidence of their eligibility, proof of compliance with the necessary legal requirements to carry out the contract effectively.
2.1.4	Eligible Goods and Services	(i) All goods and related services to be supplied under the Contract shall have their origin in eligible source countries, defined in the <i>Bid Data Sheet (BDS/Technical Specification)</i>, and all expenditures made under the contract will be limited to such goods and related services. (ii) For purposes of this clause, "origin" means the place where the goods are mined, grown, or produced, or the place from which the related services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing, or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially-recognized product is obtained that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components. (iii) The origin of goods and services is distinct from the nationality of the Bidder. In any case, the requirements of Rules 10 & 26 of PPR-14, shall be followed.
2.1.5	Cost of Bidding	The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its Bid, and the Procuring Agency named in the Bid Data Sheet, hereinafter referred to as "the Procuring Agency," will in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the Bidding process.
2.1.6	One person one bid	(i) As per Rule 36A of Punjab Procurement Rules 2014, a Bidder shall submit only one Bid against same item/lot in the same bidding process, either individually as a Bidder, (in JV) or any similar arrangement. (ii) No Bidder can be a sub-contractor while submitting a Bid individually or as a member of a joint venture in the same Bidding process. (iii) A Bidder, if acting in the capacity of sub-contractor in any Bid, shall not submit bid for the same.
2.2 - The Bidding Documents		
2.2.1	Content of Bidding Documents	(i) The goods required, Bidding procedures, and contract terms are prescribed in the Bidding documents. The Bidding documents, inter alia, include: a. Invitation to Bids b. Instructions to Bidders (ITB)

		c. Technical Specifications d. Bid Data Sheet e. General Conditions of Contract (GCC) f. Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) g. Schedule of Requirements h. Bid Form i. Manufacturer's Authorization Form j. Bidder Profile Form k. General Information Form l. Affidavit m. Bid Security Form n. Technical Bid Form o. Contract Form p. Financial Bid Form / Price Schedule q. Performance Guarantee Form r. Check List (ii) The Bidder is required to examine all instructions, forms, terms, and specifications in the Bidding documents. Failure to furnish all information as required by the Bidding documents or to submit a Bid not responsive to the Bidding documents in every respect will be at the Bidder's risk and may result in the rejection of its Bid. (iii) In case of discrepancies between the Invitation to Bid and the Bidding Documents listed in ITB 2.2.1 (i) above, the said Bidding Documents, not in conflict with any provision of PPR-14, will take precedence. (iv) The Procuring Agency is not responsible for the completeness of the Bidding Documents and their addenda, if they were not obtained directly from the Procuring Agency or from its website or website of PPRA. Re-confirming from the Procuring Agency that all pages/ contents have been properly and clearly received is the prime responsibility of the Bidder.
2.2.2	Clarification of Bidding Documents	i) A prospective Bidder requiring any clarification of the Bidding documents may notify the procuring agency on the e-Procurement System (EPADS). In case, e-procurement system (EPADS) is not working properly then the bidder may inform the Procuring Agency in writing or by e-mail. The Procuring Agency will respond via same medium to the prospective bidder in which it receives the clarification request but no later than seven (07) days prior to the deadline for the submission of Bids prescribed in the Bid Data Sheet. The Procuring Agency's response (including an explanation of the query but without identifying) will be uploaded on the e-Procurement System (EPADS) for clarity of bidders. ii) The Procuring Agency will within three (03) working days after receiving the request for clarification, respond the prospective bidder in writing or in electronic form to any request for clarification provided that such request is received not later than seven (07) days prior to the deadline for the submission of Bids. As prescribed in ITB 2.2.2 (i), above. However, this clause shall not apply in case of alternate methods of Procurement.

		iii) Copies of the Procuring Agency's response will be uploaded on e-Procurement System (EPADS), including a description of the inquiry, but without identifying its source. iv) Should the Procuring Agency deem it necessary to amend the Bidding Documents as a result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure under ITB 2.2.3 v) If indicated in the BDS, the Bidder's designated representatives invited at the Bidder's cost to attend a pre-Bid meeting at the place, date and time mentioned in the BDS. During this pre-Bid meeting, prospective Bidders may request clarification of the schedule of requirement, the Evaluation Criteria or any other aspects of the Bidding Documents. vi) Minutes of the pre-Bid meeting, if applicable, including the text of the questions asked by Bidders, including those during the meeting (without identifying the source) and the responses given, together with any responses prepared after the meeting will be transmitted promptly to all prospective Bidders by uploading same on the e-Procurement System (EPADS). Any modification to the Bidding Documents that may become necessary as a result of the pre-Bid meeting shall be made by the Procuring Agency exclusively through the use of an Addendum pursuant to ITB 2.2.3. Non-attendance at the pre- Bid meeting will not be a cause for disqualification of a bidder.
2.2.3	Amendment of Bidding Documents	i) At any time prior to the deadline for submission of Bids, but not later than three (3) days before the closing date of the submission of Bid, the Procuring Agency, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder, may modify the Bidding documents by amendment. Any such change/amendment in the Bidding documents shall be provided in a timely manner, through e-Procurement System (EPADS), not later than three (3) days, and on equal opportunity basis as per Rule-25(3) OR Rule 25(4) of PPR-14 as the case may be. ii) All prospective Bidders that have received the Bidding documents will be notified of the amendment in writing or by email, and will be binding on them. Before the deadline for submission of Bids, the Procuring Agency for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder or pre-Bid meeting may modify the Bidding Documents by issuing addenda. iii) Before the deadline for submission of E- Bids, the Procuring Agency for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder or pre-Bid meeting may modify the Bidding Documents by issuing addenda. iv) Any addendum issued including the notice of any

		extension of the deadline shall be part of the Bidding Documents and shall be communicated in writing or in any identified electronic form, e.g. email that secures record of the content of subject communication. v) In order to allow prospective Bidders reasonable time in which to take an addendum into account in preparing their Bids, the Procuring Agency, at its discretion, may extend the deadline for the submission of Bids, as per rule 29 of PPR-14, in the manner similar to the original advertisements, so as to avoid any inconvenience and to doubly ensure level playing field for all prospective bidders.
2.3 - Preparation of E-Bids		
2.3.1	Language of Bid	The E-Bid prepared by the Bidder, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Bid exchanged by the Bidder and the Procuring Agency shall be written in the language specified in the Bid Data Sheet. Supporting documents and printed literature furnished by the Bidder may be in same language.
2.3.2	Bid Form	The Bidder shall complete the Bid Form and the appropriate Price Schedule (Financial Bid) furnished in the Bidding documents, indicating the goods to be supplied, a brief description of the goods, their country of origin, quantity, and prices.
2.3.3	Bid Prices	(i) The Bidder shall indicate on form 8.10 the unit prices (where applicable) and total Bid price of the goods it proposes to supply under the contract. (ii) Prices indicated on the Price Schedule shall be item wise & package/lot wise. (iii) The Bidder's separation of price components in accordance with ITB Clause 2.3.3(ii) above will be solely for the purpose of facilitating the comparison of Bids by the Procuring Agency and will not in any way limit the Procuring Agency's right to contract on any of the terms offered. (iv) Prices quoted by the Bidder shall be fixed during the Bidder's performance of the contract and not subject to variation on any account, unless otherwise specified in the Bid Data Sheet. A Bid submitted with an adjustable price quotation will be treated as non-responsive and may be rejected.
2.3.4	Bid Currencies	Prices shall be quoted in Pak Rupees unless otherwise specified in the Bid Data Sheet.
2.3.5	Documents Establishing Bidder's Eligibility and Qualification	(i) Pursuant to ITB Clause 2.1.3, the Bidder shall furnish, as part of its Bid, documents establishing the Bidder's eligibility to Bid and its qualifications to perform the contract if its Bid is accepted. (ii) The documentary evidence of the Bidder's eligibility to Bid shall establish to the Procuring Agency's satisfaction that the Bidder, at the time of submission of its Bid, is eligible as defined under ITB Clause 2.1.3. (iii) The documentary evidence, of the Bidder's qualifications to perform the contract if its Bid is accepted, shall establish to the Procuring Agency's satisfaction: a. that, in the case of a Bidder offering to supply goods

		under the contract which the Bidder did not manufacture or otherwise produce, the Bidder has been duly authorized by the goods' Manufacturer [<i>Manufacturer's Authorization form No. 8.3</i>] or producer to supply the same in Pakistan; (where applicable) b. that the Bidder has the financial, technical, and production or supplying capability necessary to perform the contract; c. that, in the case of a Bidder not doing business within Pakistan, the Bidder is or will be (if awarded the contract) represented by an Agent in that country equipped, and able to carry out the Supplier's maintenance, repair, and spare parts-stocking obligations prescribed in the Conditions of Contract and/or Technical Specifications; and d. that the Bidder meets the qualification criteria listed in the Bid Data Sheet.
2.3.6	Documents Establishing Goods' Eligibility and Conformity to Bidding Documents	(i) Pursuant to ITB Clause 2.1.4, the Bidder shall furnish, as part of its Bid, documents establishing the eligibility and conformity to the Bidding documents of all goods and related services which the Bidder proposes to supply under the contract. (ii) The documentary evidence of conformity of the goods and services to the Bidding documents may be in the form of literature/ brochures, drawings, data and shall consist of: a. a detailed description of the essential technical and performance characteristics of the goods; b. a list giving full particulars, including available sources and current prices of spare parts, special tools, etc., necessary for the proper and continuing functioning of the goods for a period to be specified in the Bid Data Sheet, following commencement of the use of the goods by the Procuring Agency; and c. an item-by-item commentary on the Procuring Agency's Technical Specifications demonstrating responsiveness of the goods and services to those specifications, or a statement of deviations and exceptions to the provisions of the Technical Specifications. (iii) For purposes of the commentary to be furnished, the Bidder shall note that standards for workmanship, material, and equipment, as well as references to brand names or catalogue numbers designated by the Procuring Agency in its Technical Specifications, are intended to be descriptive only and not restrictive. (iv) Where a sample(s) is required by a procuring agency, the sample shall be: a. submitted on the date, in the quantities, dimensions and other details requested in the BDS; b. carriage paid; c. received on, or before, the date mentioned in BDS; and

		d. Evaluated to determine compliance with all characteristics listed in the BDS. (v) Submission of samples for the tendered items is mandatory before deadline / closing date of tender (if mentioned in the Evaluation / Eligibility Criteria). Failure to submit a sample will result in the disqualification of the respective procurement. Samples will be tested by the Procuring Agency itself or through any testing authority. If sample is consumed / damaged during testing, no liability shall rest on part of the procuring agency. Bidder shall be bound to deposit testing fee if required. Brouchers/technical details of the offered items / commitment to full specifications & requirements of procuring agency must be provided / attached with the technical bids especially in case of non-depositing of sample. (vi) The Procuring Agency may retain the sample(s) of the successful Bidder till the successful delivery of the goods. Procuring Agency may reject the Bid if the sample(s):- - do(es) not conform to all characteristics prescribed in the bidding documents; and - is/are not submitted within the specified time clearly mentioned in the Bid Data Sheet. (vii) Where it is not possible to avoid using a propriety article as a sample, a Bidder shall make it clear that the propriety article is displayed only as an example of the type or quality of the goods being Bided for, and that competition shall not thereby be limited to the extent of that article only. (viii) Samples made up from materials supplied by a Procuring Agency shall not be returned to a Bidder nor shall a Procuring Agency be liable for the cost of making them. (ix) All samples, belonging to an unsuccessful Bidder may be kept by the Procuring Agency till thirty (30) days from the date of award of contract or exhaust of all the grievance forums (including those pending at Authority's Level or in some Court of Law). (x) Pursuant to the requirements as indicated in ITB 2.3.6, the Bidder shall furnish, as part of its Bid, all those documents establishing the eligibility in conformity to the terms and conditions specified in the Bidding Documents for all goods and related services which the Bidder proposes to deliver. (xi) The Bidder shall also furnish a list giving full particulars, including available sources and current prices of goods, spare parts, special tools, etc., necessary for the proper and continuing functioning of the Goods during the period specified in the BDS following commencement of the use of the goods by the Procuring Agency. (xii) The required documents and other accompanying documents must be in English. In case any other language than English is used the pertinent translation attested by the embassy in country of manufacturer into English shall be attached to the original version.
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2.3.7	Bid Security	(i) The Bidder shall furnish, as part of its e-Bid, a scanned Bid security in the amount specified in the Bid Data Sheet. The hard copy of bid security must be submitted to the procuring agency any time before the closing time of bid submission. The relevant branch of bank (from where the bid security is being issued for bidder) should also send scanned copy at the email address procurement@ctd.gop.pk (ii) The Bid security is required to protect the Procuring Agency against the risk of Bidder's conduct which would warrant the security's forfeiture Pursuant to ITB Clause 2.3.8. (vii). (iii) The Bid security shall be in Pakistan Rupees and shall be in one of the following forms: "Bank call-deposit (CDR), Demand Draft (DD), Pay Order (PO) or Banker's cheque valid for ninety (90) Days, beyond the validity of Bid, or until furnishing of the Performance Security, whichever is later". (iv) Any Bid not secured in accordance with ITB Clauses 2.3.8 (i) and (ii) may be rejected by the Procuring Agency as non-responsive. (v) Unsuccessful Bidders' Bid security will be discharged or returned as promptly as possible after due process pursuant to ITB clause 2.3.8 (ii) or along with unopened financial proposal as per rule 38(2)(a)(vii) of PPR-14, which shall take precedence. (vi) The successful Bidder's Bid security will be discharged upon the Bidder signing the contract, pursuant to ITB Clause 2.6.1, and furnishing the Performance Guarantee, pursuant to ITB Clause 2.6.2. (vii) The Bid security may be forfeited: a. If a Bidder withdraws its Bid during the period of Bid validity specified by the Bidder on the Bid Form; or b. In the case of a successful Bidder, if the Bidder: i. Fails to sign the contract in accordance with ITB Clause 2.6.3; or ii. Fails to furnish Performance Guarantee in accordance with ITB Clause 2.6.2; or • If the blacklisting proceedings under Section-17A of PPRA Act, 2009 read with Rule-21 of PPR-14 are initiated and the bidder is declared blacklisted after due process of law.
2.3.8	Period of Validity of Bids	(i) Bids shall remain valid for the period specified in the Bid Data Sheet after the date of Bid opening prescribed by the Procuring Agency. A Bid valid for a shorter period may be rejected by the Procuring Agency as non-responsive. (ii) In exceptional circumstances, the Procuring Agency may solicit the Bidder's consent to an extension of the period of validity (as per rule-28 of PPR-14). The request and the responses thereto shall be made through e-Procurement System (EPADS). In case, e-procurement system (EPADS) is not working properly then the Procuring Agency may inform the bidder in writing or by email. The Bid security provided under ITB Clause 2.3.8 shall also be suitably

		extended. A Bidder may refuse the request without forfeiting its Bid security. A Bidder accepting the request will not be required nor permitted to modify its Bid.
2.3.9	Format and Signing of Bid	(i) The Bidder shall prepare e-bids of the scanned documents in the form of PDF file and as per requirements in tender document. (ii) The Bidder shall authorize a person/ persons for signing, submission and further correspondence with Procuring Agency on behalf of bidder. Authority letter must be part of e-bid. However, in case of any issue bidder shall be responsible for all consequences. (iii) All scanned pages of the e-Bid, shall be signed and stamped by the authorized person before scanning. (iv) Any interlineation, erasures, or overwriting shall be valid only if they are initialed by the authorized person for signing the e-Bid. (v) The name and position held by each person signing the authorization must be typed or printed below the signature. All scanned pages of the e-Bid, shall be signed and stamped by the authorized person before scanning. (vi) Any interlineations, erasures, or overwriting shall be valid only if they are signed by the person or persons signing the Bidder. (vii) The Bidder shall furnish information as described in the Form of Bid on commissions or gratuities, if any, paid or to be paid to agents relating to this Bid and to contract execution if the Bidder is awarded the contract.
2.4 – Submission of Bids		
2.4.1	Procedure for e-bids submission	i) The bidder shall submit e-bids (separate technical and financial) as per requirement of the e-Procurement System (EPADS). ii) Single Stage Two Envelope Procedure will be followed, the e-bid shall comprise two e-bids submitted simultaneously, one called the Technical e-Proposal and the other Financial e- Proposal.
2.4.2	Deadline for Submission of E-Bids	(i) E-Bids must be submitted on the e-Procurement System (EPADS) no later than the time and date specified in the Bid Data Sheet. Physical Bids received through courier services or delivered by the bidder, shall not be accepted. (ii) The Procuring Agency may, at its discretion and as per rule 29 of PPR-14, extend this deadline for the submission of Bids by amending the Bidding documents in accordance with ITB Clause 2.2.2 & 2.2.3 in which case all rights and obligations of the Procuring Agency and Bidders previously subject to the deadline will thereafter be subject to the deadline as extended. (iii) E-Bids must be submitted on the e-Procurement System (EPADS) no later than the date and time specified in the BDS.
2.4.3	Late E-Bids	(i) E-Bids will not be accepted on the e-Procurement System (EPADS), after closing time. However, if any E-bid is submitted on the system after closing time due to some technical glitch in the e-Procurement System (EPADS), in that case bid shall be declared late and rejected.

		(ii) The Procuring Agency shall not consider for evaluation any Bid that is submitted after the deadline for submission of E-Bids.
2.4.4	Modification and E-Bids Withdrawal of E-Bids	(i) The Bidder may modify or withdraw its e-bid after the e-bid's submission and prior to the deadline prescribed for submission of e-bids. (ii) No e-bid may be modified after the deadline for submission of Bids. (iii) No e-bid may be withdrawn in the interval between the deadline for submission of e-bids and the expiration of the period of Bid validity specified by the Bidder on the Bid Form. Withdrawal of a Bid during this interval may result in the Bidder's forfeiture of its Bid security (along with other remedies available under PPR-14), pursuant to the ITB Clause 2.3.8 (vii). (iv) A Bidder may amend its e-bid after it has been submitted and prior to the deadline for submission of Bids. (v) Revised e-bid may be submitted after the withdrawal of the original e-bid before the deadline for submission of Bids.
2.5 - Opening and Evaluation of Bids		
2.5.1	Opening of E-Bids by the Procuring Agency	(i) The Procuring Agency will open all e-Bids on EPADS, in public, in the presence of Bidders, or their representatives who choose to attend, and other parties with a legitimate interest in the Bid proceedings at the place, on the date and at the time, specified in the BDS. The Bidders' representatives present physically, shall also sign a register/attendance sheet as proof of their attendance. (ii) E-Bids shall be opened on the e-Procurement System (EPADS) one at a time, in case of Single Stage One Envelope Procedure, the Bidders names, the Bid prices, the total amount of each E- Bid, the presence or absence of Bid Security, Bid Securing Declaration and such other details as the Procuring Agency may consider appropriate, will be announced by the Procurement Evaluation Committee. (iii) In case of Single Stage Two Envelope Procedure, the Procuring Agency will open on the e-Procurement System (EPADS) the Technical Proposals in public at the address, date and time specified in the BDS in the presence of Bidders, designated representatives who choose to attend and other parties with a legitimate interest in the Bid proceedings. The Financial Proposals will remain unopened on the e-Procurement System (EPADS) until the specified time of their opening. (iv) Technical e-bids shall be opened one at a time, and the following read out and recorded: (a) the name of the Bidder; (b) the presence of a Bid Security, if required; and (c) Any other details as the Procuring Agency may consider appropriate. (v) Bidders are advised to depute a representative with the knowledge of the content of the e-Bid who shall verify the information read out from the submitted documents. Failure to depute a representative or to point out any un-read information by the deputed Bidder's representative shall indemnify the Procuring Agency against any claim or

		failure to read out the correct information contained in the Bidder's e- Bid. (vi) The Procuring Agency shall prepare minutes of the Bid opening. The record of the Bid opening shall include, as a minimum: the name of the Bidder and whether or not there is a late bid, the Bid price if applicable. (vii) The Bidders' representatives who are present shall be requested to sign on the attendance sheet. The omission of a Bidder's signature on the record shall not invalidate the contents and affect the record. (viii) Minutes of the Financial Bid Opening shall be recorded and report shall be uploaded by the procuring agency on its website or shared to all bidders through the e-Procurement System (EPADS). <i>If Procuring Agency opts for single stage one envelope procedure as per rule 38(1) of PPR-14, clause (vi) to (xiii) should be formulated accordingly by the procuring agency.</i>
2.5.2	Confidentiality	(i) Information relating to the examination, clarification, evaluation and comparison of Bids and recommendation of contract award shall not be disclosed to Bidders or any other persons not officially concerned with such process until the time of the announcement of the respective evaluation report in accordance with the requirements of rule 37 of PPR-14. (ii) Any effort by a Bidder to influence the Procuring Agency processing of Bids or award decisions may result in the rejection of its Bid. (iii) Not with standing ITB Clause 2.2.2 from the time of Bid opening to the time of contract award, if any Bidder wishes to contact the Procuring Agency on any matter related to the Bidding process, it should do so in writing or on e-Procurement System (EPADS).
2.5.3	Clarification of E-Bids	(i) As per rule 33(2) of PPR-14, to assist in the examination, evaluation and comparison of E-Bids and post-qualification of the Bidders, the Procuring Agency may, at its discretion, ask any Bidder for a clarification of its Bid including breakdown of prices to determine its reasonability. Any clarification submitted by a Bidder that is not in response to a request by the Procuring Agency shall not be considered. (ii) The request for clarification and the response shall be in writing or in electronic forms that provide record of the content of communication. In case of Single Stage Two Envelope Procedure, no change in the prices or substance of the Bid shall be sought, offered, or permitted. Whereas in case of Single Stage One Envelope Procedure, only the correction of arithmetic errors discovered by the Procuring Agency in the evaluation of Bids should be sought in accordance with ITB Clause 2.5.6. (iii) The alteration or modification in the e-bid which in any way compromise the following parameters will be considered as a change in the substance of a bid: - Evaluation & qualification criteria; - Required scope of work or specifications; - All securities requirements;

		d) Tax requirements; e) Terms and conditions of bidding documents. f) Change in the ranking of the Bidder (iv) From the time of e-bid opening to the time of Contract award if any Bidder wishes to contact the Procuring Agency on any matter related to the Bid it should do so on the e-Procurement System (EPADS). In case e-Procurement System is not working properly then the bidder may contact the Procuring Agency in writing or by e-mail.
2.5.4	Preliminary Examination	(i) The Procuring Agency will examine the e-bids to determine whether they are complete, whether any computational errors have been made, whether required sureties have been furnished, whether the documents have been properly signed, and whether the e-bids are generally in order. (ii) Arithmetical errors will be rectified on the following basis: a. If there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the total price that is obtained by multiplying the unit price and quantity, the unit price shall prevail, and the total price shall be corrected. If the Supplier does not accept the correction of the errors, its Bid may be rejected, and its Bid security may be forfeited. b. If there is a discrepancy between words and figures, the amount in words will prevail. (iii) Prior to the detailed evaluation, the Procuring Agency will determine the responsiveness of each e-bid to the Bidding documents, pursuant to ITB Clause 2.5.5. For purposes of these Clauses, a responsive e-bid is one which conforms to all the terms and conditions of the Bidding documents without material deviations. Deviations from, or objections or reservations to critical provisions, such as those concerning Bid Security (ITB Clause 2.3.8), Applicable Law (GCC Clause 30), Taxes and Duties (GCC Clause 32) & mandatory Registrations/Renewals will be deemed to be a material deviation. The Procuring Agency's determination of a e-bid's responsiveness is to be based on the contents of the e-bid itself without recourse to extrinsic evidence. (iv) If a e-bid is not responsive, it will be rejected by the Procuring Agency and may not subsequently be made responsive by the Bidder by correction of the non-conformity. (v) Prior to the detailed evaluation of e-bids, the Procuring Agency will determine whether each e-bid: a. Meets the eligibility criteria defined in ITB 2.1.3 and ITB 2.1.4; b. Has been prepared as per the format and contents defined by the Procuring Agency in the Bidding Documents; c. Has been properly signed; d. Is accompanied by the required securities; and e. Is responsive to the requirements of the Bidding

		Documents. The Procuring Agency's determination of a e-bid's responsiveness will be based on the contents of the e-bid itself.
2.5.5	Examination of Terms and Conditions; Technical Evaluation	(i) The Procuring Agency shall examine the e-bid to confirm that all terms and conditions specified in the GCC and the SCC have been accepted by the Bidder without any material deviation or reservation. (ii) The Procuring Agency shall evaluate the technical aspects of the e-bid submitted to confirm that all requirements specified in Section III-Technical Specifications, Section VII – Schedule of Requirements, and Evaluation Criteria as provided in BDS, have been met without material deviation or reservation. (iii) If after the examination of the terms and conditions and the technical evaluation, the Procuring Agency determines that the e-bid is not responsive in accordance, it shall reject the Bid.
2.5.6	Correction of Errors	(i) E-bids determined to be substantially responsive will be checked for any arithmetic errors. Errors will be corrected as follows: - If there is a discrepancy between unit prices and the total price that is obtained by multiplying the unit price and quantity, the unit price shall prevail, and the total price shall be corrected, unless in the opinion of the Procuring Agency there is an obvious misplacement of the decimal point in the unit price, in which the total price as quoted shall govern and the unit price shall be corrected; - If there is an error in a total corresponding to the addition or subtraction of sub-totals, the sub-totals shall prevail and the total shall be corrected; and - Where there is a discrepancy between the amounts in figures and in words, the amount in words will govern. - Where there is discrepancy between grand total of price schedule and amount mentioned on the Form of Bid, the amount referred in Price Schedule shall be treated as correct subject to elimination of other errors. (ii) The amount stated in the e-bid will be adjusted by the Procuring Agency in accordance with the above procedure for the correction of errors. The concurrence of the Bidder shall be considered as binding upon the Bidder. If the Bidder does not accept the corrected amount, its e-bid will then be rejected, and the Bid Security may be forfeited or the Bid Securing Declaration may be executed in accordance with ITB 2.3.8.
2.5.7	Conversion to Single Currency	As per rule 32(2) of PPR-14, to facilitate evaluation and comparison, the Procuring Agency will convert all Bid prices expressed in the amounts in various currencies in the which the bid prices as follows: For the purposes of comparison of e-bids quoted in different currencies, the price shall be converted into a single currency specified in the bidding documents. The rate of exchange shall be the selling rate, prevailing on the date of opening of bids

		specified in the bidding documents, as notified by the State Bank of Pakistan on that day, in case of holiday in State Bank of Pakistan on the day of opening financial bids, then previous working day's ex-change rates will prevail.
2.5.8	Post-Qualification & Evaluation of Bids	(i) In the absence of prequalification, the Procuring Agency will determine to its satisfaction whether the Bidder is qualified to perform the contract satisfactorily, in accordance with the evaluation criteria listed in BDS & pursuant to ITB Clause 2.1.3. (ii) The determination will take into account the Bidder's financial, technical, and production / supplying capabilities. It will be based upon an examination of the documentary evidence of the Bidder's qualifications submitted by the Bidder, pursuant to ITB Clause 2.3.6, as well as such other information required for eligibility/qualification expressed in Bid Data Sheet as the Procuring Agency deems necessary and appropriate. (iii) The Procuring Agency will technically evaluate and compare the e-bids which have been determined to be responsive, pursuant to ITB Clause 2.5.5, as per Technical Specifications required. (iv) The financial evaluation of a Bid will be on the basis of form of Price Schedules/ Financial Bid Form 8.10 which must include clear cut instruction regarding item wise or lot wise evaluation inclusive of prevailing taxes, duties, fees etc. (evaluation will be carried out item/lot wise as the case may be)
2.5.9	Contacting the Procuring Agency	(i) Subject to ITB Clause 2.5.3, no Bidder shall contact the Procuring Agency on any matter relating to its e-bid, from the time of the Bid opening to the time the evaluation report is made public i.e., 10 days before the contract is awarded. If the Bidder wishes to bring additional information or has grievance to the notice of the Procuring Agency, it should do so on the e-Procurement System (EPADS). (ii) Any effort by a Bidder to influence the Procuring Agency during e-bid evaluation, or e-Bid comparison may result in the rejection of the Bidder's e-bid.
2.5.10	Grievance Redressal	(i) As per Rule-67 of PPR-14, Procuring Agency shall constitute a Grievance Redressed Committee (GRC) comprising of odd number of persons with proper powers and authorization to address the complaints. The GRC shall not have any of the members of the Procurement Evaluation Committee. The Committee may preferably have one subject specialist depending upon the nature of the procurement in addition to one person with legal background as per their availability to the Procuring Agency. (ii) Any bidder feeling aggrieved by any act of the procuring agency after the submission of his e-bid may lodge a written complaint concerning his grievances within five days of announcement of the technical evaluation report and ten days after issuance of final evaluation report.

		(iii) In case, the complaint is filed after the issuance of the final evaluation report, the complainant cannot raise any objection on technical evaluation of the report. Provided that detail technical evaluation report has been uploaded on the website of the Authority. Provided further that the complainant may raise the objection on any part of the final evaluation report in case where single stage single envelope bidding procedure is adopted. (iv) The Committee shall investigate and decided the compliant within days of receipt of the compliant. (v) The Committee may: - decide the compliant lodged by any bidder before proposal submission date; - set aside the decision of technical evaluation committee; - uphold the decision of technical evaluation committee; - modify the decision of technical evaluation committee; and - recommend scrapping of the procurement process with reasons to be recorded in writing. (vi) Any bidder aggrieved by any decision of the Grievance Redressal Committee may file a representation before the Managing Director, PPRA, Punjab as per Punjab Procurement Rules 67A. (vii) As per Clause 15 of Punjab Procurement Regulations 2024, The bidder shall file a grievance before the grievances redressal committee through the e-PADS. The bidder shall also submit a hard copy of the same to the grievances redressal committee in accordance with rule 67 of the rules. All the grievances filed by the bidders or contractors shall be redressed efficiently, as soon as possible, in accordance with the rule 67 of the rules. The Procuring agency shall inform the decision on the grievance to the bidder on the e-PADS or in the form of letter, as the case may be.
2.6 - Award of Contract		
2.6.1	Notification of Award	(i) Prior to the expiration of the period of Bid validity, the Procuring Agency will notify the successful Bidder in writing by registered letter or through e-Procurement System (EPADS) that its e-bid has been accepted. (ii) The notification of award will constitute the formation of the Contract. (iii) Upon the successful Bidder's furnishing of the Performance Guarantee pursuant to ITB Clause 2.6.2 (i), the Procuring Agency will promptly notify each unsuccessful Bidder and will discharge its Bid security, pursuant to ITB Clause 2.3.8 (v).
2.6.2	Performance Guarantee	(i) The procuring agency in writing give date to the successful bidder for the provision of Performance guarantee. The successful bidder shall furnish the Performance Guarantee in accordance with the Conditions of Contract, in the Performance Guarantee Form provided in the Bidding documents, or in another form acceptable to the Procuring Agency.

		(ii) Failure of the successful Bidder to comply with the requirement of ITB Clause (i) above or ITB Clause 2.6.3 shall constitute sufficient grounds for the annulment of the award and forfeiture of the Bid security along with other remedies available under PPR-14. After that, the Procuring Agency may decide to award the contract to the next lowest evaluated Bidder, keeping in view the Bid validity time, or call for new bids keeping in view the concept of value for money as defined under rule-2(ae) read with Principles of Procurement as enunciated in rule-4 of PPR-14.
2.6.3	Signing of Contract/ Issuance of Purchase Order	(i) At the same time as the Procuring Agency notifies the successful Bidder that its e-bid has been accepted, the Procuring Agency will send the Bidder the Contract Form provided in the Bidding documents, incorporating all agreements between the parties or will issue the purchase order <i>[as the case may be]</i>. (ii) Under rule-63 of PPR-14, where the Procuring Agency requires formal signing of contract, within seven (07) days of issuance of the Contract Form, the successful Bidder shall sign and mention date of the contract and return it to the Procuring Agency. (iii) Where no such formal signing is required by the procuring agency, the procuring agency shall issue purchase order after the receipt of required performance guarantee, as per rule 55 of PPR-14.
2.6.4	Award Criteria	Subject to ITB Clause 2.6.2, under rule-55 of PPR-14, the Procuring Agency will award the contract to the successful Bidder whose Bid has been determined to be responsive and has been determined to be the lowest evaluated Bid, provided that the Bidder has been determined to be qualified to perform the contract satisfactorily.
2.6.5	Procuring Agency's Right to Vary Quantities at Time of Award	The Procuring Agency reserves the right at the time of contract award to increase or decrease the quantity of goods and services originally specified in the Schedule of Requirements without any change in unit price or other terms and conditions, on the analogy of rule-59 (c)(iv) of PPR-14 (not more than 15%).
2.6.6	Procuring Agency's Right to accept or reject all e-bids	(i) As per rule 35 of PPR-14, the Procuring Agency reserves the right to accept or reject all e-bids or proposals (and to annul the e-bidding process) at any stage/time prior to the acceptance of any bid or proposal, without thereby incurring any liability towards the Bidders. (ii) The Bidders shall be promptly informed about the rejection, if any. (iii) The Procuring Agency shall upon request communicate to any Bidder, the grounds for its rejection of all e-bids or proposals, but shall not be required to justify those grounds.

Coercive practice by impairing or harming, or threatening to impair or harm, directly or indirectly, any party or the property of the party to influence the actions of a party to achieve a wrongful gain or to cause a wrongful loss to another party; ii. Collusive practice by arrangement between two or more parties to the procurement process or Contract execution, designed to achieve with or without the knowledge of the procuring agency to establish prices at artificial, noncompetitive levels for any wrongful gain; iii. Offering, giving, receiving or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence the acts of another party for wrongful gain; iv. Any act or omission, including a misrepresentation, that knowingly or recklessly misleads, or attempts to mislead, a party to obtain a financial or other benefit or to avoid an obligation; v. Obstructive practice by harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in a procurement process, or affect the execution of a Contract or deliberately destroying, falsifying, altering or concealing of evidence material to the investigation or making false statements before investigators in order to materially impede an investigation into allegations of a corrupt, fraudulent, coercive or collusive practice; or threatening, harassing or intimidating any party to prevent it from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the investigation or from pursuing the investigation, or acts intended to materially impede the exercise of inspection and audit process."
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ii) Blacklisting & Debarment:

Blacklisted Bidders i.e. firms/companies/sole proprietor/ general order suppliers/ JVs etc. and those found involved in "Corrupt Practices" are not allowed to participate in bidding.

Requirements & Procedure for Blacklisting & Debarment:

As per S-17A of PPRA, Act, 2009:

"17A. Blacklisting.– (1) A procuring agency may, for a specified period and in the prescribed manner, debar a bidder or Contractor from participating in any public procurement process of the procuring agency, if the bidder or Contractor indulges in corrupt practice or any other proscribed practice.

(2) The Managing Director may, in the prescribed manner, debar a bidder or Contractor from participating in any public procurement process of all or some of the procuring agencies for a specified period.

(3) Any person, aggrieved from a decision of a procuring agency, may within prescribed period prefer a representation before the Managing Director.

(4) A procuring agency or any other person, aggrieved from a decision of the Managing Director, may within prescribed period prefer a representation before the Chairperson whose decision on such representation shall be final.

As per rule 21 of PPR-14:

21. Blacklisting.–(1) A procuring agency may, for a specified period, debar a bidder or Contractor from participating in any public procurement process of the procuring agency, if the bidder or Contractor has:

(a) acted in a manner detrimental to the public interest or good practices;

(b) consistently failed to perform his obligation under the Contract;

(c) not performed the Contract up to the mark; or

(d) indulged in any corrupt practice.

(2) If a procuring agency debars a bidder or Contractor under sub-rule (1), the procuring agency:

(a) shall forward the decision to the Authority for publication on the website of the Authority; and

(b) may request the Authority to debar the bidder or Contractor for procurement of all procuring agencies.

(3) The Managing Director may debar a bidder or Contractor of any procuring agency from participating in any public procurement process of all or some of the procuring agencies for such period as the Managing Director may determine.

(4) Any person aggrieved by a declaration made under rule 20 or a decision under sub-rule (1) of this rule may, within thirty days from the date of the publication of the information on the website of the Authority, file a representation before the

		Managing Director and the Managing Director may pass such order on the representation as he may deem fit. (5) Any person or procuring agency aggrieved by an order under sub-rule (3) or (4) may, within thirty days of the order, file a representation before the Chairperson and the Chairperson may pass such order on the representation as he may deem appropriate. (6) The mechanism or process for barring a bidder or Contractor from participating in procurement process of a procuring agency, procuring agencies and a representation under this rule is specified in the Schedule appended to these rules. As per Schedule appended with PPR-14: SCHEDULE see sub-rule (6) of rule 21 BLACKLISTING MECHANISM OR PROCESS 1. The procuring agency may, on information received from any resource, issue show cause notice to a bidder or Contractor. 2. The show cause notice shall contain: (a) precise allegation, against the bidder or Contractor; (b) the maximum period for which the procuring agency proposes to debar the bidder or Contractor from participating in any public procurement of the procuring agency; and (c) the statement, if needed, about the intention of the procuring agency to make a request to the Authority for debarring the bidder or Contractor from participating in public procurements of all the procuring agencies. 3. The procuring agency shall give minimum of seven days to the bidder or Contractor for submission of written reply of the show cause notice. 4. In case, the bidder or Contractor fails to submit written reply within the requisite time, the procuring agency may issue notice for personal hearing to the bidder or Contractor/ authorize representative of the bidder or Contractor and the procuring agency shall decide the matter on the basis of available record and personal hearing, if availed. 5. In case the bidder or Contractor submits written reply of the show cause notice, the procuring agency may decide to file the matter or direct issuance of a notice to the bidder or Contractor for personal hearing. 6. The procuring agency shall give minimum of seven days to the bidder or Contractor for appearance before the specified officer of the procuring agency for personal hearing. 7. The procuring agency shall decide the matter on the basis
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		of the available record and personal hearing of the bidder or Contractor, if availed. 8. The procuring agency shall decide the matter within fifteen days from the date of personal hearing unless the personal hearing is adjourned to a next date and in such an eventuality, the period of personal hearing shall be reckoned from the last date of personal hearing. 9. The procuring agency shall communicate to the bidder or Contractor the order of debarring the bidder or Contractor from participating in any public procurement with a statement that the bidder or Contractor may, within thirty days, prefer a representation against the order before the Managing Director of the Authority. 10. The procuring agency shall, as soon as possible, communicate the order of blacklisting to the Authority with the request to upload the information on its website. 11. If the procuring agency wants the Authority to debar the bidder or Contractor from participating in any public procurement of all procuring agencies, the procuring agency shall specify reasons for such dispensation. 12. The Authority shall immediately publish the information and decision of blacklisting on its website. 13. In case of request of a procuring agency under para 11 or representation of any aggrieved person under rule 21, the Managing Director shall issue a notice for personal hearing to the parties and call for record of proceedings of blacklisting. The parties may file written statements and documents in support of their contentions. 14. In case of representation of any aggrieved person or procuring agency under rule 21, the Chairperson shall issue a notice for personal hearing to the parties and may call for the record of the proceedings. The parties may file written statements and documents in support of their contentions. 15. In every order of blacklisting under rule 21, the procuring agency shall record reasons of blacklisting and also reasons for short, long or medium period of blacklisting. 16. The Authority shall upload all the decisions under rule 21, available with it, on its website. But the name of a bidder or Contractor shall immediately be removed from the list of blacklisted persons on expiry of period of blacklisting or order of the competent authority to that effect, whichever is earlier. 17. An effort shall be made for electronic communication of all the notices and other documents pursuant to this mechanism or process.” iii) Furthermore, Bidders must keep themselves aware of the provision stated in clause 5.4 and clause 24.1 of the General Conditions of Contract.

"The Contract Price" means the price payable to the Supplier under the Contract for the full and proper performance of its contractual obligations. c. "The Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials which the Supplier is required to supply to the Procuring Agency under the Contract. d. "The Services" means those services ancillary and related to the supply of the Goods, such as transportation and insurance, and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, maintenance & repair and other such obligations of the Supplier covered under the Contract. e. "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract contained in this section. f. "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract. g. "The Procuring Agency" means the organization purchasing the Goods & Services, as named in SCC. h. "The Procuring Agency's country" is the country named in SCC. i. "The Supplier" means the Bidder or firm supplying the Goods and Services under this Contract. j. "The Project Site," where applicable, means the place or places named in SCC. k. "Day" means calendar day. l. "e-bid" means electronic bids (separate financial and technical) to be submitted by bidders on e-Procurement System (EPADS).
2.	Application	These General Conditions shall apply to the extent that they are not superseded by provisions of other parts of the Contract.
3.	Country of origin (where applicable)	(i) All Goods and Services supplied under the Contract shall have their origin in the countries and territories eligible under the rules, as further elaborated in the SCC. (ii) For purposes of this Clause, "origin" means the place where the Goods were mined, grown, or produced, or from where the Services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing, or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product is obtained that

		is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components. (iii) The origin of Goods and Services is distinct from the nationality of the Supplier. In any case, the requirements of rules 10 & 26, PPR-14, shall be followed.
4. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance. (ii) The Supplier shall not, without the Procuring Agency's prior written consent, make use of any document or information enumerated in GCC Clause 5.5.1 except for purposes of executing the Contract. (iii) Should any inspected or tested Goods fail to conform to the Specifications, the Procuring Agency may reject the Goods, and the Supplier shall either replace the rejected Goods or make alterations necessary to meet specification requirements free of cost to the Procuring Agency. (iv) The Procuring Agency's right to inspect, test and, where necessary, reject the Goods after the Goods' arrival in the Procuring Agency's country shall in no way be limited or waived by reason of the Goods having previously been inspected, tested, and passed by the Procuring Agency or its representative prior to the Goods' shipment from the country of origin. (v) Nothing in GCC Clause 5.8 shall in any way release the Supplier from any warranty or other obligations under this Contract.
9.	Packing	(i) The Supplier shall provide such packing of the Goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the Contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during

Incidental Services	(i) The Supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:- - satisfactory performance for specified time/quantity on-site and/or supervision of on-site assembly and/or start-up of the supplied Goods; - furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied Goods; - furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied Goods; - performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied Goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the Supplier of any warranty obligations under this Contract; and

		e. training of the Procuring Agency's personnel, at the Supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied Goods. (ii) Prices charged by the Supplier for incidental services shall be included in the Contract Price for the Goods and shall not exceed:- - the prevailing rates charged for other parties by the Supplier for similar services; and - original price of goods.
14.	Spare Parts	As specified in SCC, the Supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the Supplier:- - such spare parts as the Procuring Agency may choose to purchase from the Supplier, provided that this choice shall not relieve the Supplier of any warranty obligations under the Contract; and - in the event of termination of production of the spare parts: - advance notification to the Procuring Agency of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the Procuring Agency to procure needed requirements; and - Following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the Procuring Agency, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.
15.	Warranty	(i) The Supplier warrants that the Goods supplied under the Contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models selected by the Procuring Agency, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the Contract. The Supplier further warrants that all Goods supplied under this Contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the Procuring Agency's specifications) or from any act or omission of the Supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied Goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination. (ii) This warranty shall remain valid as required in Section – III "Technical Specifications" after the Goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the Contract, or as required in Section – III "Technical Specifications" after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC. (iii) The Procuring Agency shall promptly notify the Supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty. (iv) Upon receipt of such notice, the Supplier shall, within

		the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective Goods or parts thereof, without costs to the Procuring Agency. (v) If the Supplier, having been notified, fails to rectify the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, within a reasonable period, the Procuring Agency may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the Supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the Procuring Agency may have against the Supplier under the Contract/relevant provision of PPR-14 including Blacklisting. (vi) This warranty shall remain valid for at least twelve (12) months after supply of goods/items/services or after consumption of goods (if otherwise not provided in the bidding documents/contract) to and accepted at the final destination.
16.	Payment	(i) The method and conditions of payment to be made to the Supplier under this Contract shall be specified in SCC. (ii) The Supplier's request(s) for payment shall be made to the Procuring Agency in writing, accompanied by an invoice describing, as appropriate, the Goods delivered and Services performed, and by documents submitted pursuant to GCC Clause 5.10, and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the Contract. (iii) As per rule-62 of PPR-14, payments shall be made promptly by the Procuring Agency, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the Supplier, provided the work is satisfactory. (iv) The currency of payment is PAK RUPEES. (v) The successful bidder shall be paid by CTD against invoice for the goods delivered/services completed satisfactorily to the CTD in Framework Contract, payment shall be made against each Purchase order after the satisfaction of CTD
17.	Prices	Prices charged by the Supplier for Goods delivered and Services performed under the Contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the Supplier in its Bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC.
18.	Change Order	(i) The Procuring Agency may at any time, by a written order given to the Supplier pursuant to GCC Clause 5.31, make changes within the general scope of the Contract, only if required for the successful completion of the job, in any one or more of the following:- - drawings, designs, or specifications, where Goods to be furnished under the Contract are to be specifically manufactured for the Procuring Agency; - the method of shipment or packing; - the place of delivery; and/or - the Services to be provided by the Supplier. (ii) If any such change causes an increase or decrease in the cost of, or the time required for, the Supplier's

		performance of any provisions under the Contract, an equitable adjustment shall be made in the Contract Price or delivery schedule, or both, and the Contract shall accordingly be amended. Any claims by the Supplier for adjustment under this clause must be asserted within thirty (30) days from the date of the Supplier's receipt of the Procuring Agency's change order. But, in no case, the overall impact of the change should exceed 15% of the contract cost and no provisions of PPR-14 should be violated.
19.	Contract Amendments	Subject to GCC Clause 5.18, no variation in or modification of the terms of the Contract shall be made except by the mutual consent through written amendment signed by the parties. No variation in finalized brands/ makes/models shall be allowed except in special conditions where the manufacturer has stopped producing or suspended that model or the latest model of similar series or version has been launched by the manufacturer or non-availability due to international mergers of the manufacturers or similar unavoidable constraints.
20.	Assignment	The Supplier shall not assign the whole of contract to anybody else. However, some parts of contract or its obligations may be assigned to sub-contractors with the prior written approval of the procuring agency.
21.	Sub-contracts	(i) The Supplier shall notify the Procuring Agency in the Bid of all subcontracts to be assigned under this Contract. Such notification, in the original Bid or later, shall not relieve the Supplier from any liability or obligation under the Contract. (ii) Subcontracts must comply with the provisions of GCC Clause 5.20.
22.	Delays in the Supplier's Performance	(i) Delivery of the Goods and performance of Services shall be made by the Supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the Procuring Agency in the Schedule of Requirements. (ii) If at any time during performance of the Contract, the Supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the Goods and performance of Services, the Supplier shall promptly notify the Procuring Agency in writing of the fact of the delay, Its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the Supplier's notice, the Procuring Agency shall evaluate the situation and may at its discretion extend the Supplier's time for performance, with or without liquidated damages, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of Contract. (iii) Except as provided under GCC Clause 5.25, a delay by the Supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the Supplier liable to the imposition of liquidated damages pursuant to GCC Clause 5.23, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 5.22.2 without the imposition of liquidated damages.

23.	Liquidated Damages	Subject to GCC Clause 5.25, if the Supplier fails to deliver any or all of the Goods or to perform the Services within the period(s) specified in the Contract, the Procuring Agency shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the Contract, deduct from the Contract Price, as liquidated damages, a sum equivalent to the percentage specified in SCC of the delivered price of the delayed Goods or unperformed Services for each week or part thereof of delay until actual delivery or performance, up to a maximum deduction of the percentage specified in SCC. Once the maximum is reached, the Procuring Agency may consider termination of the Contract pursuant to GCC Clause 24 along with other remedies available under PPR-14.
24.	Termination for Default	(i) The Procuring Agency, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of Contract, by written notice of default sent to the Supplier, may terminate this Contract in whole or in part:- a. if the Supplier fails to deliver any or all of the Goods within the period(s) specified in the Contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the Procuring Agency pursuant to GCC Clause 5.22; b. if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the Contract; or c. if the Supplier, in the judgment of the Procuring Agency has engaged in corrupt practices in competing for or in executing the Contract. For the purpose of this clause, corrupt practices will be defined as per Section-2 (d) of The PPRA Act, 2009. "Corrupt practices" in respect of procurement process, shall be as given in S-2 (d) of PPRA, Act, 2009: d. "corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of a public official, bidder or Contractor in the procurement process or in Contract execution to the detriment of the procuring agency; or misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a Contract, collusive practices among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial, noncompetitive levels and to deprive the procuring agency of the benefits of free and open competition and any request for, or solicitation of anything of value by any public official in the course of the exercise of his duty; it may include any of the following:- 1. coercive practice by impairing or harming, or threatening to impair or harm, directly or indirectly, any party or the property of the party to influence the actions of a party to achieve a wrongful gain or to cause a wrongful loss to

		another party; 2. collusive practice by arrangement between two or more parties to the procurement process or Contract execution, designed to achieve with or without the knowledge of the procuring agency to establish prices at artificial, noncompetitive levels for any wrongful gain; 3. offering, giving, receiving or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence the acts of another party for wrongful gain; 4. any act or omission, including a misrepresentation, that knowingly or recklessly misleads, or attempts to mislead, a party to obtain a financial or other benefit or to avoid an obligation; 5. obstructive practice by harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in a procurement process, or affect the execution of a Contract or deliberately destroying, falsifying, altering or concealing of evidence material to the investigation or making false statements before investigators in order to materially impede an investigation into allegations of a corrupt, fraudulent, coercive or collusive practice; or threatening, harassing or intimidating any party to prevent it from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the investigation or from pursuing the investigation, or acts intended to materially impede the exercise of inspection and audit process (ii) In the event the Procuring Agency terminates the Contract in whole or in part, pursuant to GCC Clause 5.24.1, the Procuring Agency may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, Goods or Services similar to those undelivered, and the Supplier shall be liable to the Procuring Agency for any excess costs for such similar Goods or Services. However, the Supplier shall continue performance of the Contract to the extent not terminated.
25.	Force Majeure	(i) Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 5.22, 5.23, and 5.24, the Supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its Performance Guarantee, liquidated damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that its delay in performance or other failure to perform its obligations under the Contract is the result of an event of Force Majeure. (ii) For purposes of this clause, "Force Majeure" means an event beyond the control of the Supplier and not involving the Supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but are not restricted to, acts of the Procuring Agency in its

		sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, and freight embargoes. Both, the Procuring Agency and the Supplier, may agree to exclude certain widespread conditions e.g: epidemics, pandemics, quarantine restrictions etc. from the purview of "Force Majeure". (iii) If a Force Majeure situation arises, the Supplier shall promptly notify the Procuring Agency in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the Procuring Agency in writing, the Supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the Contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the Force Majeure event. Any difference of opinion concerning "Force Majeure" may be decided through means given herein below.
26.	Termination for Insolvency	The Procuring Agency may at any time terminate the Contract by giving written notice to the Supplier if the Supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the Supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the Procuring Agency.
27.	Termination for Convenience	(i) The Procuring Agency, by written notice sent to the Supplier, may terminate the Contract, in whole or in part, at any time for its convenience. The notice of termination shall specify that termination is for the Procuring Agency's convenience, the extent to which performance of the Supplier under the Contract is terminated, and the date upon which such termination becomes effective. (ii) The Goods that are complete and ready for shipment (if applicable) within thirty (30) days after the Supplier's receipt of notice of termination shall be accepted by the Procuring Agency on the Contract terms and prices. For the remaining Goods, the Procuring Agency may choose:- - to have any portion completed and delivered at the Contract terms and prices; and/or - to cancel the remainder and pay to the Supplier an agreed amount for partially completed Goods and Services and for materials and parts previously procured by the Supplier.
28.	Resolution of Disputes	(i) After signing the contract or issuance of purchase order, The Procuring Agency and the Supplier shall make every effort to resolve amicably by direct informal negotiation any disagreement or dispute arising between them under or in connection with the Contract. (ii) If, after thirty (30) days from the commencement of such informal negotiations, the Procuring Agency and the Supplier have been unable to resolve amicably a Contract dispute, either party may require that the

		dispute be referred for resolution to the formal mechanisms specified in SCC. These mechanisms may include, but are not restricted to, conciliation mediated by a third party, adjudication in an agreed and/or arbitration as per rule 68 of PPR-14 and in accordance with Arbitration Act-1940.
29.	Governing Language	The Contract shall be written in the language specified in SCC. Subject to GCC Clause 30, the version of the Contract written in the specified language shall govern its interpretation. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the Contract which are exchanged by the parties shall be written in the same language.
30.	Applicable Law	The Contract shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of Punjab (Pakistan) unless otherwise specified in SCC.
31.	Notices	(i) Any notice given by one party to the other pursuant to this Contract shall be sent to the other party in writing or by any information technology mean for the time being in use and acceptable in ordinary course of business to the other party's address specified in SCC. (ii) A notice shall be effective when delivered or on the notice's effective date, whichever is later.
32.	Taxes and Duties	Supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted Goods & Services to the Procuring Agency. In case of imposition of new taxes/duties or concession thereof after the deadlines for the submission of bids the effect thereof shall be borne or availed by the procuring agency as the case may be.
33.	Framework Contract Period	The Contract Period of this procurement shall be as per contract signed between the Procuring Agency and bidder starting from the date of issuance of notification of award, delivery, installation & commissioning of all Goods, till end of warranty period. Subsequent to the issuance of Letter of Intent (LOI)/ Notification of Award, Purchase Orders may be issued by the Procuring Agency under the Framework Contract [as the case may be].
