## How Mera Pyara Started – The Beginning of a New System in Pakistan

For decades, Pakistan had no centralized mechanism to reunite lost children with their families. Every province worked separately, and most such cases never even made it to official records. Many children ended up in shelter homes, hospitals, or wandered the streets without any way to reach their families.

Seeing this gap, [Mera Pyara – Virtual Center for Child Safety](#) initiated:

- Lost children's data could be collected.
- Clues could be analyzed.
- Families could be traced.
- Interviews could be broadcast online.
- And reunification could be done in a safe, legal way.

What started as a small project in Punjab quickly turned into a nationwide humanitarian network.

From its beginning till now, Mera Pyara - Virtual Center for Child Safety has:

- Child Protection Units

### **They collect data on:**

- Lost children
- Elderly individuals with memory loss
- Mentally challenged Person
- People with Disabilities
- Daef and Mute Child, who cannot share their identity

Interviews are recorded and posted on the **official Mera Pyara Facebook page**, where people watch and recognize their loved ones.

## Kiran Reunited after 17 Years

After thousands of reunions, one case from Karachi became a symbol of patience, destiny, and hope.

## A Step Outside Home That Changed a Lifetime

Years ago, a little child named **Kiran** was visiting her grandmother in Islamabad. Like any child, she went out to buy ice cream. But somehow, somewhere, she got lost, and her life changed forever.

With no memory of her way, Kiran somehow reached Karachi. In 2008, she was taken to the **Edhi Center**, confused and unable to explain what had happened.
